

Thank you for all your support of the Foundation. May God bless you and all your loved ones.





### Seminarian Studies Hispanic Culture

"This is how one should regard us. As servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God" – Cor. 4:1.

For Joel Sember, priesthood has service at its core. The priesthood is a vocation to serve Christ in a special way. Priests are God's messengers, bringing the Gospel to the world.

Last year, Joel traveled to Guadalajara, Mexico for a Spanish language and cultural immersion program. During Joel's eight-week stay he improved his knowledge and use of the Spanish language. He also learned more about the Mexican culture by going on school sponsored tours and attending lecture activities.

"Immersion programs can play a crucial role in preparing a seminarian who plans to serve our growing Hispanic population here in Northeastern Wisconsin. I am so pleased that we have a fund in the Catholic Foundation that provides training programs for our seminarians like Joel," Fr. Doug LeCaptain, Director of Vocations for the Diocese of Green Bay.





This is now my 5th day in Mexico and things are going very well. I get up between 6:30-7:00 am. My house mother serves me breakfast around 7:30, almost always corn flakes, papaya, and a muffin with some kind of fruit juice.

There are about 12 students at the school right now with more coming next week. I have a grammar class from 9:00 am - 1:00 pm with a quite elderly widow, slow and systematic, who also teaches English in schools.

Then I go back to my house for the big afternoon meal, called "la comida" (the food). It is always soup and bread, followed by a main course with plenty of fresh vegetables, and finally a dessert (always something fruity).

Conversation classes in the afternoon are from 4-6. I have a young teacher who speaks very quickly. We end up talking a lot about politics, the city, the United States, and whatever else. Back home I have a small dinner and am usually in bed around 10:30.

I hope everyone is doing well at the end of June. God bless.

# Stewardship Conference Impacts Parish Leaders

Last October a grant from the Catholic Foundation gave a shot of excitement to the *Stewardship—A Way of Life* movement across the Diocese. Over 40 parish representatives took three intense days in Chicago to learn more about Stewardship at the 2003 International Catholic Stewardship Conference (ICSC).

Speakers ranging from parish leaders to diocesan directors of stewardship, imparted their knowledge, experiences and best practices on Stewardship to almost 1,700 people from throughout the world.

"I have received incredible information and insights I would not have obtained on my own. I will bring this knowledge back to my parish as we plan the year for *Stewardship—A Way Of Life*," said John Schober, St. Joseph Parish in Appleton.

The Catholic Foundation of the Diocese of Green Bay was able to offer one tuition scholarship for each parish that chose to send a representative. "It is through the generosity of the Follett Family Stewardship Fund and the Starboard Media Foundation Fund, sponsor of Relevant Radio, this was made possible," said Cindi Brawner, Executive Director of the Catholic Foundation.



Students Enjoy an 'Alternative' Spring Break





For the typical college student spring break means "fun in the sun," but for a few students from University of Wisconsin–Green Bay and University of Wisconsin–Oshkosh it means carrying out Christ's mission to help those in need. These students chose to take an Alternative Spring Break.

They went to Pearisburg, VA and Mississippi to help build a Habitat for Humanity house, put a deck on an adult day care facility, and install a merry-go-round in a local park, among other projects.

"It's about stretching people's comfort zones and living the faith," says Laurie Svatek, campus minister from UW Green Bay. "For a lot of students this is their first experience with poverty. And unless you've experienced it, it's hard to know its impact."

"I am no longer the person I was before I left. Now I recognize how blessed I am, and instead of complaining about how bad life is, I think of the people of Pearisburg and realize that I'm pretty lucky. Thanks for changing my life," said one student.

Through a grant from the Catholic Foundation, the Alternative Spring Break program is able to offer college students this once in a lifetime opportunity.




