

Lumen Christi Grant

The Lumen Christi grant is the result of the first major Diocesan fundraising effort in the Diocese of Green Bay, conducted in 1988. Since its inception, Lumen Christi has distributed more than \$27 million in assistance. The grant is comprised of three different components each year:

- Grants for tuition assistance for academic development of educational leaders, whether in religious education programs or a Catholic school. This includes Master of Theology and Master of Educational Administration programs.
- 2. An annual grant to every parish in the Diocese for their Religious Education Program.
- 3. An annual grant to every Catholic school and school system in the Diocese of Green Bay.

Your grant application **must** have approval from your supervisor to be considered for funding.

Average Grant Awards

 Average awards vary and are paid directly to the educational institution the awardee attends.
